### Which Bathroom Mirror Is Right for You?

Effective selection among different bathroom mirror types depends on room size, wall space, lighting, storage requirements, and overall design style,

Style also plays a significant part. The frame, finish and design of your mirror can add personality, tie a scheme together, or soften hard surfaces like tiles and glass. In a room where fixtures tend to be permanent, a mirror is one of the easier ways to update the look without a full renovation.

Mirror proportions and placement influence comfort and usability. Height, width, and distance from the basin all affect reflection quality. Alignment with tiles, taps, and light fittings supports a coherent appearance. Suitable mirror types therefore emerge once those constraints become clear.

From a practical point of view, a good bathroom mirror supports everything from skincare and shaving to applying makeup or checking your outfit. When paired with the right lighting, it becomes a useful part of your daily routine as well as a decorative feature.

## Getting the Proportions Right

The key to a great bathroom is proportion. The first step in choosing a bathroom mirror is to get the proportions correct. A mirror that is too large or too small can disrupt the balance of the room.

A common mistake in bathroom design is choosing a mirror that's the wrong size for the space. If it's too small, the mirror can look out of place, but if it's too large, it can overwhelm the room.

The shape and size of your mirror can have a surprisingly big impact on how your bathroom looks and feels. It's not just about what fits on the wall, but more importantly, the right proportions for the space and how you use it.

A mirror that is too small can feel lost, while one that is too large might overwhelm the room. Aim for something that sits comfortably above the basin or vanity, ideally not wider than the unit below. If you are placing mirrors on other walls, think about visual balance and how the reflection will affect the feel of the space.

**TIP:** A key is to measure your space carefully, particularly in relation to your vanity unit.

### Mirror Width

- A bathroom mirror that matches or slightly undershoots vanity width feels balanced. Excessively narrow mirrors appear undersized and reduce reflective area, while very wide mirrors dominate compact walls and crowd adjacent features such as tall cabinets.
- **Measure Your Vanity:** As a general rule, the mirror should not be wider than your vanity. For a clean, symmetrical look, choose a mirror that is the exact width of the vanity unit below it. This creates a neat, aligned appearance. If you prefer, or that is not possible, choose a mirror that is slightly smaller. A good guideline is to select one that is about 70-80% of the vanity's width. This ensures the mirror looks balanced without being overwhelmed by the unit below.

**TIP:** Combine mirror with dedicated task lighting - Wall lights either side of a bathroom mirror or integrated LED strips provide even illumination across the face. Harsh downlights directly above the mirror create strong shadows and reduce accuracy during detailed grooming tasks.

**TIP:** For double vanities, you can either choose two smaller mirrors or one large mirror that spans the width of the vanity.

## Mirror Positioning

- Mirrors should be positioned relative to main users' eye lines. It should be high enough for everyone in the household to use comfortably. A good starting point is to ensure the mirror extends at least 250mm above and below the eyeline of its users. For most people, this means that the middle of the mirror will be positioned around 145 to 150 cm from the floor.
- Measure the space between your vanity countertop and any light fixtures above the vanity. You'll want to leave at least a few centimetres of clearance at both the top and bottom.
- It's best to leave clearance to avoid splashes from taps/basins. This would require around 15 to 20 cm space between the top of the sink and the bottom edge of the mirror. Generally, the higher you can install the mirror and retain balance, the better.

**TIP:** Taller mirrors can give the illusion of higher ceilings, while a wider mirror can help open up the room horizontally each making the room feel more spacious

## Round Mirrors

Round mirrors create a focal point and soften the look of the bathroom and add a sense of flow. Round bathroom mirrors can soften a space and, especially in bathrooms with strong lines or square tiles add visual interest to the space.

They bring a touch of elegance and are particularly effective when paired with pedestal sinks or vanities with curved features.

**Tip:** A large round mirror above the vanity creates a strong focal point. Pair it with wall lights on either side to enhance the look.

## Pill (Oval) Mirrors

Pill (oval) bathroom mirrors bring a touch of elegance adding a design-led touch. The gentle curved shape, like round mirror softens a room's design. When mounted vertically (portrait) the more linear shape of a Pill mirror can draw the eye upward, which helps make ceilings feel higher providing a more spacious feel.

When mounted horizontally (landscape) they will emphasise linear lines for a more streamlined look.

They bring a touch of elegance and are particularly effective when paired with pedestal sinks or vanities with curved features. An oval or pill-shaped mirror offers a modern, sophisticated feel.

Pairing a tall mirror with a slim frame adds a sleek, sophisticated touch to the overall design.

## Arched Mirrors

A tall, narrow mirror can draw the eye upward, creating a feeling of height in the room. The straight bottom line of the arch visually anchors the mirror and connects it with the straight lines of a vanity giving a more integrated look to the bathroom.

## Rectangular and Square Mirrors:

Rectangular and square mirrors are a very versatile shape. They fit well within most design schemes, from modern to classic. A rectangular mirror can be hung in either a portrait or landscape orientation, depending on the space you have and the look you want to achieve.

Rectangular bathroom mirrors are a popular choice for their clean lines and as a good fit for most walls. They are especially popular above sinks and vanity units, where the straight edges mirror the shape of the furniture.

Rectangular and square mirrors are classic and versatile. They are ideal for almost any bathroom style and will create a sense of structure and symmetry, which can help ground your design.

**TIP:** Place two rectangular mirrors in portrait position side by side over a double vanity for a symmetrical and balanced look.

## Framed vs Frameless Mirrors

A frameless mirror offers a clean, minimalist look that is perfect for contemporary bathrooms. It is simple, understated, and helps maintain a feeling of openness. Framed mirrors, on the other hand, add a decorative touch. The frame can match other finishes in the room, such as taps or light fixtures, creating a cohesive design. Finishes like Matt Black, Brushed Brass, and Chrome are all available to complement your chosen style.

## Frameless Mirrors

Frameless bathroom mirrors create sleek and modern designs through clean edges, large uninterrupted surfaces, and close integration with wall finishes, especially in simple, geometric bathroom layouts.

For a truly minimalist look, frameless mirrors are an excellent option. Without a frame, the mirror almost disappears into the wall, making it ideal for modern streamlined styles or small bathrooms where you want to keep things sleek and simple.

Many frameless bathroom mirrors use simple rectangles or softly rounded corners to maintain calm lines.

## Framed bathroom mirrors

Framed mirrors use a visible border around the glass, so the frame material and profile contribute strongly to its style.

The frame defines the overall outline and often introduces colour, texture, or ornamentation.

The frame of the mirror is another key detail that can harmonize with the bathroom's overall design. When selecting a frame, consider the other finishes in the bathroom, such as your taps, shower brassware, accessories & other hardware. An exact match is not required; it is more about harmonization.

Metal frames in finishes like matt black, brushed brass or chrome are popular choices because they pair well with most bathroom hardware.

**TIP:** *Framed Mirrors: Careful alignment with tiles, basins, and light fittings matters for frameless bathroom mirrors. Small misalignments become more obvious without a frame to disguise differences. Soft pads behind corners protect the backing from hard surfaces, and a small clearance above taps or splashbacks prevents clashes.*

## Lighting

Beyond function, lighted mirrors can also enhance the overall look and feel of your bathroom.

Lighting plays a key role in how useful your bathroom mirror is day to day. Whether you are getting ready in the morning or winding down in the evening, the right lighting can make tasks easier and help set the mood in the room.

Bathroom lighting is often either too harsh or too dim. The right mirror lighting gives you even, shadow-free illumination that helps with things like shaving, skincare and makeup. It also improves visibility without straining your eyes.

Lighting design around the bathroom mirror affects grooming comfort. Side lights or integrated LED bands reduce shadows under the chin and brows. Overhead lighting alone often creates

harsher contrasts. Light colour and brightness also influence perceived skin tone during makeup or shaving tasks.

Lighted bathroom mirrors enhance visibility at face level. Task lighting from the mirror front or sides reduces shadows that overhead fittings create. That configuration supports precise shaving, makeup application, and skincare work. Many ranges offer different colour temperatures to suit personal preferences.

**TIP:** *Combine mirror with dedicated task lighting - Wall lights either side of a bathroom mirror or integrated LED strips provide even illumination across the face. Harsh downlights directly above the mirror create strong shadows and reduce accuracy during detailed grooming tasks.*

## LED Bathroom Mirrors

These are mirrors with integrated lighting, often around the edge or behind the glass. They provide consistent, shadow-free light that is ideal for grooming, makeup and shaving. Some also include features like touch sensors or dimmers.

**Back-Lit Mirrors:** Back-lit mirrors cast a gentle glow from behind, creating a soft, ambient light that can make the bathroom feel more inviting. This style adds a sophisticated, high-end feel to the room and can serve as a subtle night light.

## LED for Energy Efficiency

LED bathroom mirrors provide energy-efficient lighting through low power consumption and long LED lifespans, so overall electricity use reduces compared with older lamp technologies.

LED strips and modules within bathroom mirrors convert a high proportion of electrical energy into light rather than heat. Lower wattage requirements support regular use without significant impact on energy bills. High-output designs still maintain efficiency relative to traditional lamp types.

Long lifespans reduce replacement frequency for LED bathroom mirror components. Those characteristic cuts waste and maintenance effort. Built-in drivers and sealed modules require correct installation and appropriate electrical protection to maintain efficiency and safety throughout service life.

## Fog-Free Bathroom Mirrors

Luminor mirrors have built-in demister pads that will turn on and off with the mirror light. These gently warm the back of the mirror, helping it stay clear even in steamy surroundings.

Bathroom mirrors fog up because of condensation. When warm, damp air from a shower or bath hits the cooler surface of the mirror, it creates a layer of steam that can make it hard to see.

This is a common problem in bathrooms with poor ventilation or high humidity. It's most noticeable in winter or when the room doesn't have time to dry out between uses. The steam settles on cold surfaces, like mirrors and tiles, and forms droplets that blur the glass.

Improving ventilation is also a very effective way to eliminate or minimise fogging. An effective extractor fan or simply leaving a window open can make a big difference.

## Cleaning & Maintenance of Luminor Mirrors

Keeping your bathroom mirror clean does not have to be a chore. With the right approach, you can keep it clear, streak-free and looking new without needing specialist products or spending loads of time.

### Quick Tips for a Streak-Free Shine

For a simple daily or weekly clean:

- Use a microfibre cloth or lint-free paper towel.
- Spray a gentle glass cleaner or a mix of vinegar and water onto the cloth (not directly on the mirror)
- Wipe in circular motions or from edge to edge
- Finish with a dry section of the cloth to buff away any streaks.

Wiping the mirror down after every shower helps prevent marks from settling.

### What to Avoid with LED or Smart Mirrors

If your mirror has LED lighting, sensors or a demister, avoid harsh chemicals and over-spraying. Liquids can seep into electrical elements and cause damage over time. Stick to gentle, non-abrasive cleaners, and take extra care around edges.

### **How do I know what size and Shape Mirror suits the bathroom?**

***TIP:** It can also be helpful to cut butcher paper to different sizes and shapes to use as mock-ups before you purchase anything. Tape the patterns against the wall, centred between the existing features on your wall, and see which size or shape you like. It can help steer you toward a style that catches your eye for your unique space. There are many kinds of mirrors out there to choose from, and it is easy to get distracted by the gorgeous designs in a store. A mock-up with the proportions of your room already in mind - or even photographed on your phone - might help you keep to what works for your space and your budget rather than select one on a whim.*
